We are now happy to provide transportation, Monday through Friday. If you have not already done so, you must register to participate in the program. Please contact the center to get the guidelines and fill out the necessary client information sheet. Once registered, remember:

- Appointments must be scheduled at least two working days in advance. Your appointment must be no earlier than 9 a.m. and no later than 2 p.m.
- Be ready 1 ½ hours prior to your appointment.
- If you need the wheelchair accessible van, please let us know when you schedule your appointment.
- The service is curb to curb, so if you need assistance, you must have a caregiver, age 18 or over, to accompany you. The driver cannot be responsible to offer assistance.

Tania is a licensed massage therapist who offers one hour massages at the center the first and third Wednesday of every month.
